



HIKING THE TERRACES OF YUCAY

Inca heritage

The ancient, extensive system of agricultural terraces and aqueducts of Yucay provide the setting for a scenic and physically undemanding hike, as well as a fascinating visit to an intriguing example of Inca agricultural technology, used by local people to this day.

This two-and-a-half-hour hike takes us past ancient irrigation channels and enormous walled agricultural terraces, while also offering the chance to see how local farmers continue to employ the same farming techniques as their Inca ancestors.

Surrounded by Andean scenery, this remote, traditional settlement offers a glimpse of the past and an insight into the world inhabited by Peru's ancient cultures, on a hike that can be enjoyed by travelers of all ages and fitness levels.
