



JEWISH HERITAGE

Lima's diversity is to be found in its myriad cultural expressions, varied gastronomy and different ethnicities, with the strong presence of the Jewish community constituting just one aspect of the city's multiculturalism. Visitors who take the time to explore their history and heritage will learn more about the troubled past and bright future of Jewish people in Peru, particularly in the context of the nation's cosmopolitan capital.

Discover some of Lima's best kept secrets in the company of a member of the city's Jewish community, local expert Elena Loeb, and share in an intimate journey through the community's main synagogues, its museum, the León Pinelo school (the only Jewish school in Peru), and the Yitzhak Rabin Park, named in honor of the 1994 winner of the Nobel Peace Prize. You can also stop for coffee at Bobe's Kitchen (in Yiddish, "bobe" means "grandmother"), the only kosher restaurant in Lima.
