Discover their environmental conservation knowledge and their natural wealth that make this magical place consider the heart of the Universe. This meaningful experience will give you a unique perspective of the value of this mountain. You can appreciate and enjoy lush green jungle full of birds, wildlife and admire snowy peaks, crystalline rivers in a tropical weather. The experience begins at around 8 am and ends at 5 pm at Palomino, Guajira.

This authentic experience is for those who want to know deeply their ancestral culture. For travelers in search of the hidden and sacred roads of the Sierra Nevada de Santa Marta. Those who wish to be in contact with the natives of the region and learn their myths and traditions.

Optional: It is possible to spend the night at extra cost. In this case it includes, lunch, dinner, breakfast and lunch, with snacks for both days. Accommodation is very basic with no running water or electricitylt's possible to have a donkey to carry baggage for an additional cost also.

Duanamake Kogi Indigenous Community

You can see Kogis kiosks of several families on large terraces in stone in different forms such as in the form of a turtle, jaguar or armadillo. Learn about medicinal plants and the basics of the indigenous gastronomy of the Sierra Nevada de Santa Marta. You will know the way of life and activities. You can appreciate the archaeological remains and sacred spaces of a relatively recent town with more than 30 years but with roots of hundreds of years.

The trek is the perfect to discover about medicinal plants, their traditional harvest, food and diet. Have a relaxing time in a sacred place with important and meaningful stones while listen about their costumes directly from an Arhuaco indigenous. Then enjoy a virgin and lonely beach with beautiful nature. Delight yourself with a nice picnic at the beach. Get an Aseguranza – a meaningful and spiritual protection from the indigenous specially done for you. Also learn from their traditional dresses, poporos and mochilas.

Los Flamingos & Ranchería Wayuú

Flora and Fauna Sanctuary

Feel the magic of the Guajira in a canoe (wooden boat) and discover a way of life in a village of the Wayuu culture. Find a charming and colorful wildlife sanctuary. You can get to discover hidden scenarios where you can see congregations of 800 or 4,000 birds from the sea, from the canoes or on the glistening lakes. Following this line get to know about cultural traditions and interact with them in a Wayuu indigenous settlement – Rancheria.

Lost City (Cuidad Perdida) 4 nights/5 days

This magical place is sacred because it managed to defeat time and return from oblivion. Today it is a place of important indigenous celebrations. Ascent to Lost City revealed in the course of each dawn a new landscape, a new climate, a new thermal floor, a new world. You'll feel lost in the universe but with the value of having lived a great experience in nature.

Day 1: El Mamey - camp 1

This adventure to the Lost City Trekking starts around 9:30 at the hotel office; where a 4 WD car will take you in a 2 ½ drive to El Mamey, the place where we have lunch and then begin the search for the sacred place of Tayronas (antique Lost City residents). At the end of the afternoon, we arrive at the first camp, and in its surroundings we'll find rivers, natural pools and waterfalls to have a relaxation moment, and then we have dinner and spend the night in hammocks.

Day 2: Camp 1-3

The day begins and we have breakfast early in the morning, then we start to walk by the riverside of Buritaca River where we will find plenty of houses that make part of a Kogi indigenous village called Mutanshi. Our trek during the day will takes about 7 hours (14.7 km, mostly uphill, some downhill) going through the jungle of Sierra Nevada de Santa Marta and enjoying the biodiversity to finally reach the

third camp (equipped with hammocks and/or beds) where we'll have a delicious dinner and rest after an adventurous day.

Day 3: Lost City - Camp 2

Early in the morning, we have breakfast to start climbing up 1200 steps to our main destination, a trail constructed by Tayrona people to reach the stunning Lost City. Once we get there, the guide will show us everything related to this magic place full of relics and ancestral stories. We will spend the morning enjoying the landscapes and having enough time to go around and take pictures (under guide's supervision). Finally, we will go back to have lunch at the third camp and then go back to the camp 2 for having dinner and to spend the night. This a 7 hours day trek (6 km, uphill and downhill).

Day 4: Camp 2 - 1

We have an early breakfast to go back to the first camp we stayed first night, where we are able to rest and chilling out at this camp and spending the last night (Here you will see the difference between the 4 and the 5 days Lost City Trekking). This is a 4 hours day trek (4.5 km some uphill, mostly downhill).

Day 5. Camp 1 - El Mamey - Santa Marta

The last day of this Lost City Trekking begins with the breakfast at the camp 1 to then continue the way back to the point where all started. Finally, we reach El Mamey, place where we will have lunch and our 4WD car will pick us up to go back to Santa Marta arriving from 3:00 to 5:00p.m. (Depending on weather conditions and your group). Tired and amazed of getting a new lifetime experience in the Sierra Nevada of Santa Marta. This a 4 hours trek (5 km some uphill, some downhill).

Includes:

- Transportation: Round trip transfers from the hotel to the starting point of the tour (El Mamey) in 4WD vehicles.
- Meals: Four (4) breakfasts, five (5) lunches, four (4) dinners. Fruits and snacks during hikes.
- Accommodation during the tour in hammocks, beds or tents, depending on availability. We provide mosquito nets and blankets every night.
- Guidance: Our guides are from the region trained by SENA, with years of experience. They are trained to provide cultural, historical and anthropological information of the indigenous communities and the area.
- Travel insurance

- Entrance to the Archaeological Park: The Teyuna Archaeological Park is managed by the Colombian Institute of Anthropology and History (ICANH); an institution assigned the Ministry of Culture of the Republic of Colombia. The entrance fee to the archaeological park is included in the tour.
